Prevention & Outreach

The Aging and Disability Resource Center offers information to community members in many settings. An important part of reaching out to the community to build awareness of support and services that are available is accomplished through a variety of public presentations and informational displays.

The Aging and Disability Resource Center provides free bone density testing as a part of outreach presentations to service and civic groups.
